The son of a union factory worker, Mike worked as a janitor to support his college education. He shared his vision for the American Dream not only through his vital contributions to the fight for workers' rights, but by elevating higher education opportunities for immigrant janitors' children. Mike García strongly believed higher education and leadership was key to helping enhance and improve the lives of union members, their families and our communities. Mike's commitment to upholding the rights and dignity of immigrant workers has inspired statewide campaigns, helping janitors and their families achieve social and economic justice across California.

About Martha Cox-Nitikman

For over three decades, Martha Cox-Nitikman worked as a tireless advocate as the Vice President of Public Policy for the Building Owners and Managers Association Greater Los Angeles (BOMA/GLA). Martha is remembered for her deep knowledge of industry issues and for her unrelenting approach to solving public challenges. Martha also served as a founding board member of Building Skills Partnership (BSP) from 2007 to 2019 and was instrumental in advocating for the expansion of its programs throughout California. As a board member, Martha helped steer the organization through immense growth.
